
## I.Facts & **Figures: Recruitment and Use of children**

The UN verified **3,377 Cases** of children recruitment (3,150 boys and 227 girls) between the period from November 2013 - June 2017, though the actual figure is thought to be even higher:



The UN documented an annual steady rise in verified numbers of cases: **351** in 2014, **538** in 2015, **1,034** in 2016 and **1,142** in 2017;

13 out of the 14 Syrian governorates were verified case of child recruitment having occured:

- Jaish Islam (103 out of 30,000)
- Ahrar al Sham (97 out of 20,000)
- Junud al-Aqsa (17 out of 1,000)
- Nur Din al-Zanki (14 out of 7,000)

In response to the conflict, humanitarian aid agencies have been mobilized for humanitarian and resilience assistance but a few who has been engaged in humanitarian dialogues with armed non-states actors in Syria to raise awareness about protection of civilians in armed conflict, most notably, Geneva Call and International Committee for Red Crescent keeping in mind that each has its our distinct approach
